

Application for 2022 Harvard Psychiatry Research Day Poster Session

This is the deadline to submit your Abstract, Poster file, optional audio recording, optional Zoom meeting link, and all other information requested below.

Unlike last year, there will NOT be a second submission form. Everything must be submitted through this form.

If the Harvard Psychiatry Research Day cannot happen in person at the Martin Conference Center on Wednesday, March 9th, then there will be a poster session website that will become live approximately one week prior to March 9th, and remain active for at least a month. The poster sessions will happen from 1:30-3:30pm on March 9th, whether they occur in person, or on Zoom during that time. The Mysell Lecture will take place from 3:45-5:15pm on March 9th, whether it need to be in person or on Zoom.

Due to the uncertainties of the pandemic, we need adequate time to upload all poster files to our virtual poster session site, in case that it is not possible to have the Harvard Psychiatry Research Day in-person. Because it takes many weeks to do this, all posters must be submitted through this form (as both PNG and PDF files) by January 17th at 5pm. There will NOT be any opportunities after January 17th to submit additional information or revisions.

INSTRUCTIONS

Acceptance of submissions is determined by the Mysell Committee of the Department of Psychiatry.

There is a limit of one-first authored presentation per person.

Abstracts are limited to 2,200 characters (INCLUDING spaces, but EXCLUDING title and authors in the character count).

The Abstract Body must include the following headings: Background, Methods, Results, Conclusions (see below these instructions for the sample abstract format).

Begin the application ONLY when you have time to finish it in one sitting. If you exit the

application before submitting the form, your responses may not be saved.

If you need to modify your submission after submitting this form, AND it is still before the initial submission deadline, you may submit a second application form with the modifications included. We will use only the latest submission that is received prior to the deadline. Once the deadline has passed, we will not accept any additional submissions/modifications.

POSTER LAYOUT REQUIREMENTS

Poster File Format: PNG file

Mandatory Dimensions: 1920 pixels (width) x 1080 pixels (height)

Warning: Poster PNG files that are wider than 2500 pixels will not be uploaded to the site.

File Size Limit: 40 MB, BUT we strongly encourage you to make it smaller than 350 KB, since larger file sizes will be compressed.

Additional File to Upload: In addition to the PNG, please also upload a SINGLE-PAGE PDF of your poster.

Tip: You could first create your poster in PowerPoint, then save as a PDF, then save as a PNG file. Alternatively, there are probably many superior methods.

Due to the high number of posters in this virtual event, and our limited staffing, we will not be able to accommodate requests to update data collection results. Please only request changes to your submission if you notice a particular error on our part, and please do so as far in advance as possible.

ZOOM RECOMMENDATIONS FOR YOUR LIVE SESSION

Should the event need to happen virtually, all presenters will be able to select one of three Zoom poster presentation session times on this form, where you will be in your own individual Zoom room for visitors to discuss your poster with you. Each session is scheduled for forty minutes on March 9th.

Individuals who do not already have a Zoom account can sign up for a free Zoom account at <https://zoom.us> in order to be able to host a forty-minute meeting. Participation in your live Zoom session is of course optional and you may opt out of this aspect of the event by indicating so in the form below.

Please be sure to test your Zoom link prior to submitting the form to make sure that it actually works. Make sure that you enable in your Zoom account settings "Embed passcode in invite link for one-click join." If you do not encrypt your password as part of your link, visitors will not be able to join your room, since your poster page will NOT have a separate place for people to view/enter a password. (Alternatively, you may use a waiting room instead of a password.)

Note: it is fine with us if you want to share a Zoom account with another presenter for the same live session. One of you could use a breakout room when someone visits your site, if the other presenter sharing your Zoom account already has a visitor. If you want to do this, there is no need to notify us. Simply submit the same Zoom meeting link in each presenter's poster application form. There will still be a "join live Zoom session" button on each of your personal presenter pages, but it will just link to the same Zoom meeting.

AUDIO RECORDING INSTRUCTIONS (optional)

Our poster website will use the SoundCloud embeddable player. If you would like to have a 2-5 minute audio recording of your presentation on your personal presenter page, then you should do the following:

1. Record yourself speaking for 2-5 minutes about your project (on your smartphone with a voice recording app such as Voice Memo, Voice Recorder, etc., or on your computer with PowerPoint, Sound Recorder, Audacity, GarageBand, QuickTime Player, etc.). Ideally your recording would generate a WAV, AIFF, FIAC, or MP3 file, but SoundCloud accepts many additional file types as well.

3. Upload your audio recording file to your SoundCloud Account by clicking the "Upload" button on the top navigation bar, then drag & drop your file, or click the file to upload
4. Make the privacy setting "Public"

TRANSCRIPTION INSTRUCTIONS FOR YOUR AUDIO RECORDING (optional, but STRONGLY ENCOURAGED if submitting a link to your audio recording)

In order to conform to the spirit of Harvard's Accessibility Guidelines, we strongly encourage you to submit a transcript of your audio recording. Here is how you can make a transcript:

Recommended Method: use a professional transcription service endorsed by Harvard, either Rev or 3Play Media to transcribe your audio file. Rev charges \$1.25/minute, and the turnaround time for project of this size is within 12 hours, with 99% accuracy guaranteed. (3Play Media charges a bit more and takes a bit longer.)

Alternative Method: use a free AI tool (e.g., Youtube or IBM Watson) and then perform manual editing to produce a transcript of your audio recording.

Sample Abstract Format

The impact of patients' expectations on clinical response: Re-analysis of data from the Hypericum Depression Trial Study Group

Background: Patient belief about assigned double-blind treatment may influence outcome. We reanalyzed data from the Hypericum Depression Trial Study Group's placebo-controlled trial of St. John's wort (SJW) versus sertraline for major depressive disorder (MDD) to determine whether patients who believed they were receiving active therapy rather than placebo obtained greater improvement, independent of assigned treatment.

Methods: 340 adults with MDD and baseline HAM-D-17 scores of ≥ 20 were

randomized to either SJW 900-1500 mg/d, sertraline 50-100 mg/d, or placebo for 8 weeks. At week 8, patients were asked to guess their assigned treatment. 243 subjects met intent-to-treat criteria. Univariate ANOVA was used to determine whether treatment assignment moderated the effect of belief on clinical improvement. Logistic regression examined whether treatment assignment moderated the effect of belief on response ($\geq 50\%$ decrease in HAM-D-17 score) and remission (final HAM-D-17 score < 8).

Results: Significant differences in improvement were found for belief in SJW ($p < 0.001$) or sertraline ($p = 0.001$) versus placebo, with strongest improvement in the SJW-believing group. Response rates were significantly stronger for subjects guessing active treatments ($p < 0.001$ for SJW and sertraline) versus placebo, and for subjects guessing SJW versus sertraline (Fisher's $p = 0.049$). Association between belief and improvement remained significant when controlling for assigned treatment ($p < 0.001$). A significant association with response was seen only for treatment guess ($p = 0.003$, 95% CI = 0.588), but not for assigned treatment. No significant associations were found for remission rates.

Conclusions: Patient expectations regarding treatment may exert a greater influence on clinical outcome than the actual medication received.
